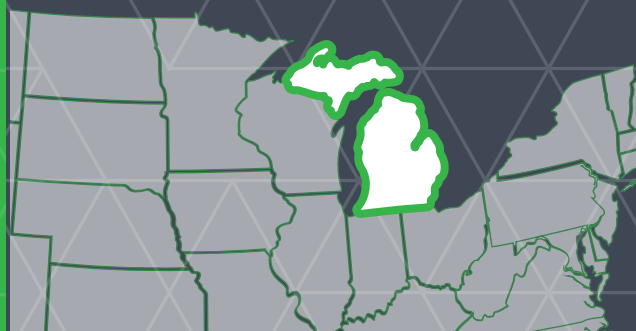

BABY YOU CAN DRIVE MY CAR!

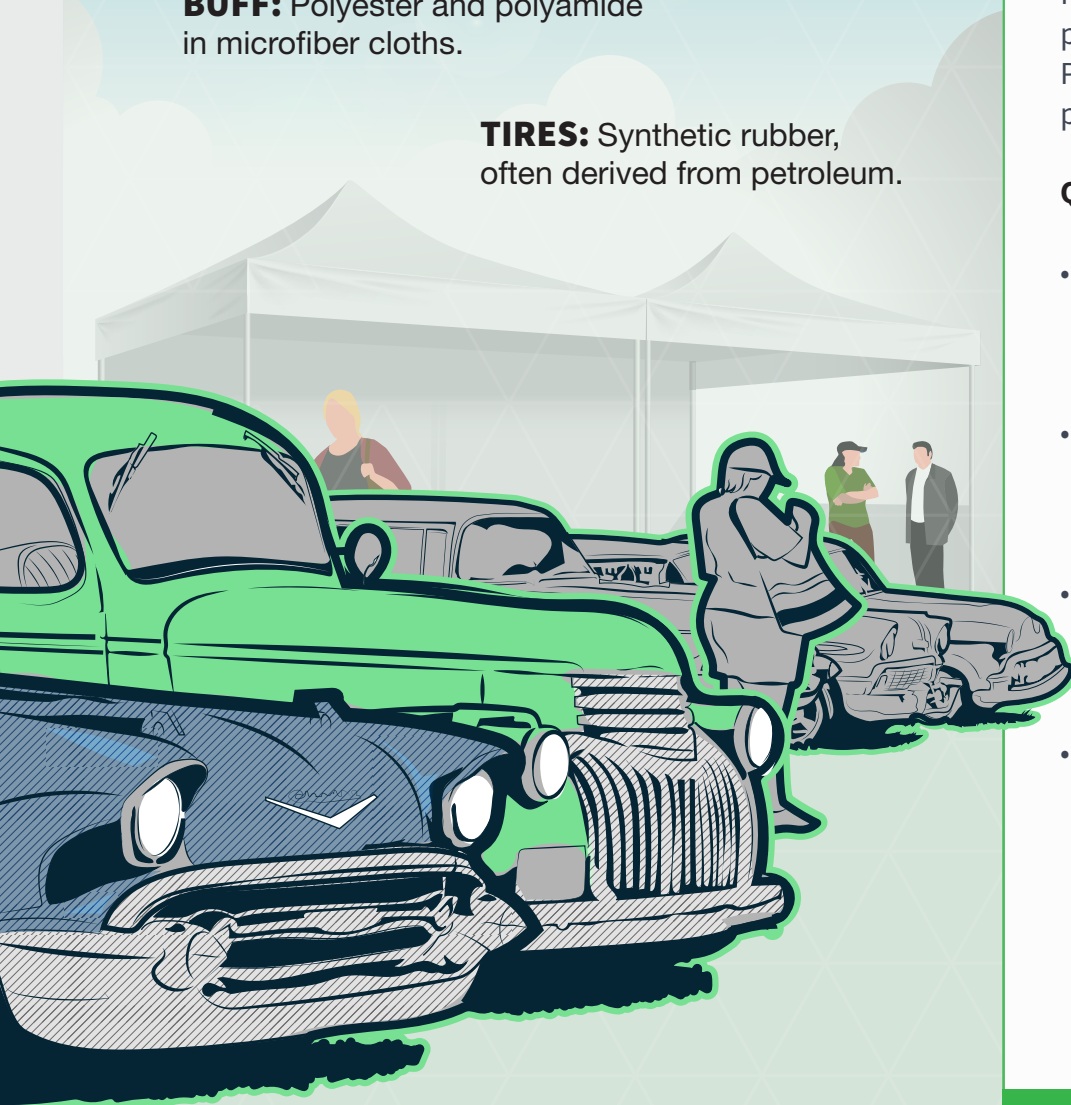
FUELS: Gasoline for classic car motors.

In virtually every human activity and invention, energy plays an important role: powering, building and improving the quality of everyday life.

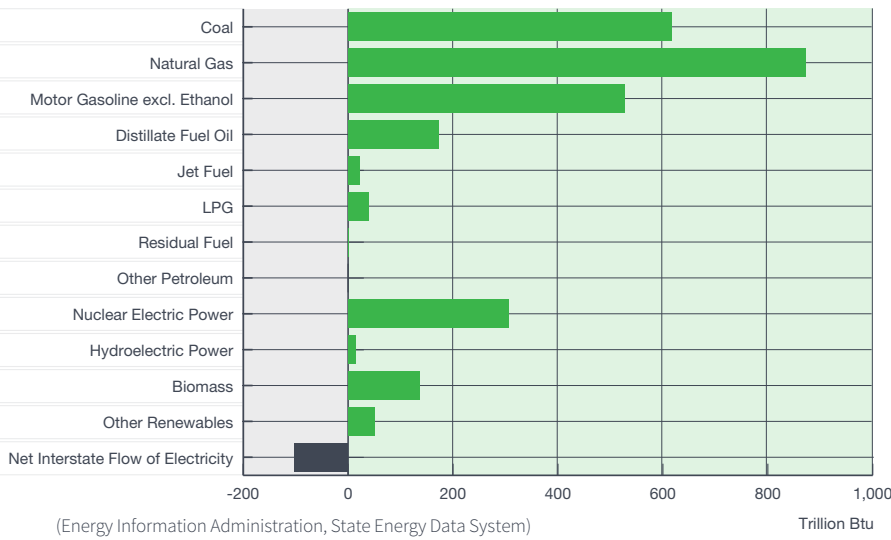

QUICK FACTS:

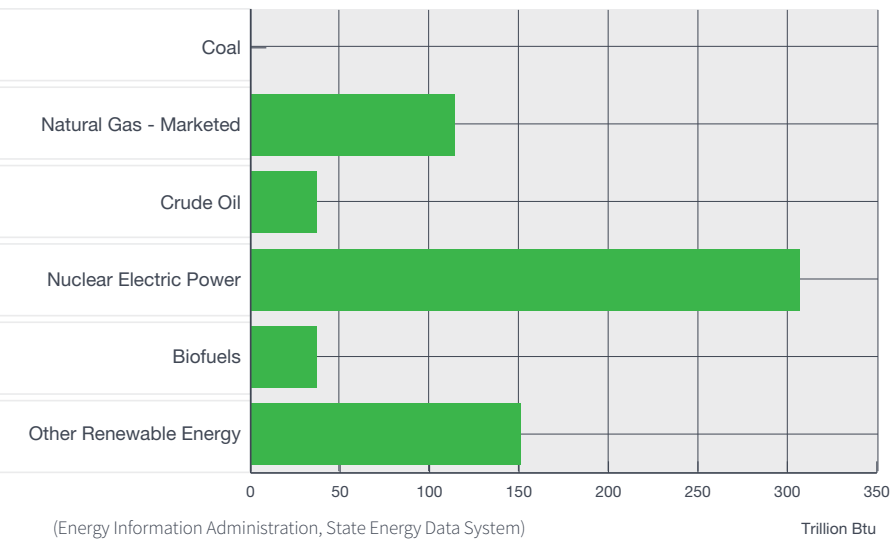
- The Woodward Dream Cruise will feature **40,000 classic** cars and **1.5 million** spectators, according to the Detroit News.
- The Dream Cruise is conducted along a **16-mile** stretch of historic Woodward Avenue through nine host communities.
- Germany's Karl Benz, pioneered the gasoline-powered internal combustion engine in **the late 1800s**.
- In **1901**, Ransom Olds' Curved Dash Oldsmobile was the first commercially successful car mass-produced on an assembly line in the U.S., according to reoldsfoundation.org.

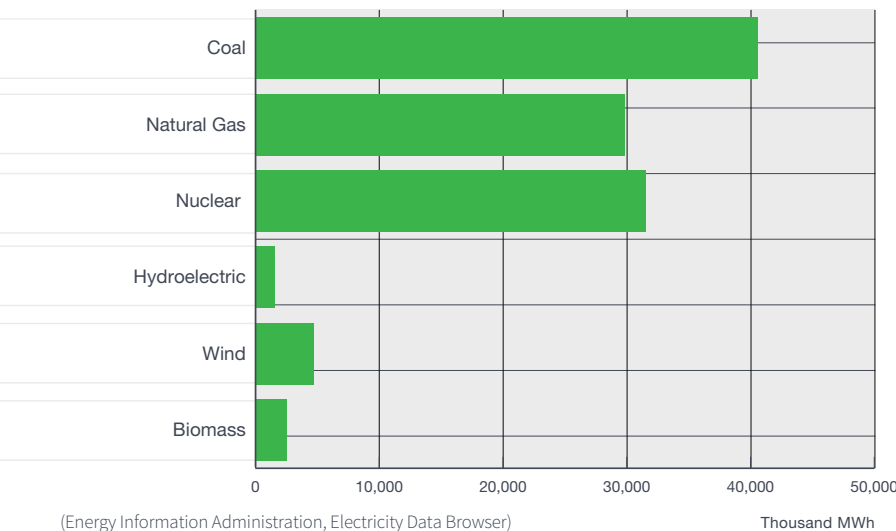
MICHIGAN ENERGY CONSUMPTION ESTIMATES 2015
