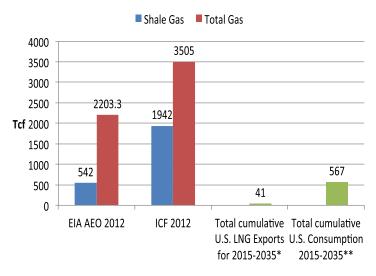


U.S. Liquefied Natural Gas Exports: America's Opportunity and Advantage

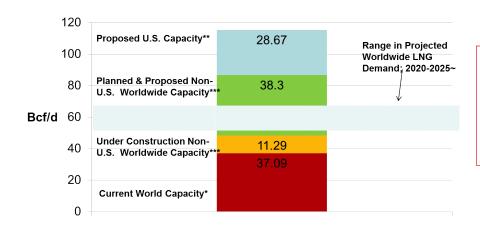
Estimates of U.S. Total Natural Gas Resource Base vs Total U.S. LNG Exports and Consumption

Projected U.S. LNG exports are less than 8% of projected U.S. consumption; and less than 2% of EIA's estimates of the U.S. total natural gas resource base.

Worldwide Planned and Proposed LNG Liquefaction Capacity Well Exceeds Projected Demand in the U.S. and the Rest of the World



The world's projected demand (in 2020-2025) for LNG is 50-65 bcf/d. However, 37 bcf/d already exists. That leaves only 13-28 bcf/d of demand needed to meet worldwide demand for LNG.
